Blood transfusion is the process of transferring blood or blood products into one's circulation intravenously. Transfusions are used for various medical conditions to replace lost components of the blood. Early transfusions used whole blood, but modern medical practice commonly uses only components of the blood, such as red blood cells, white blood cells, plasma, clotting factors, and platelets.

INTRODUCTION. Red blood cell (RBC) transfusion can be lifesaving for patients with severe anemia and/or bleeding. However, transfused blood is a foreign substance that has the potential to elicit an immune response, which can lead to destruction of the transfused RBCs (ie, immune hemolysis).

Acute transfusion reactions present as adverse signs or symptoms during or within 24 hours of a blood transfusion. The most frequent reactions are fever, chills, pruritus, or urticaria, which typically resolve promptly without specific treatment or complications.
